Background:

This symposium continues the highly successful ongoing series of ICCE symposia. Recent symposia, attended by 80-120 participants, were held in Moscow (2004), Dundee (2006) and Christchurch (2008). The Warsaw ICCE'2010 Symposium will focus on both sediment quantity and quality in river systems, and will consider the impact of climate and land use change on sediment dynamics, the wide ranging ecological, social and economic impacts of changing sediment dynamics and the need to refine sediment monitoring and modelling techniques and to develop improved management strategies in catchments and river basins.

Symposium Topics will include:

The importance of scale in studies of sediment dynamics,
Temporal variability of sediment dynamics,
Advances in monitoring sediment dynamics,
Modelling sediment dynamics,
The social and economic dimension of sediment problems and sediment studies,
Sediment impacts on aquatic ecosystems and habitats,
Sedimentation of reservoirs and detention ponds,
Sediment management and stream restoration,
Sediment quantity and quality in the Baltic Sea basin.

The Venue

The Symposium will be hosted by Warsaw University of Life Sciences – SGGW in Warsaw, Poland. The campus of the University is located in the southern part of Warsaw, approximately 10 km south of the City Centre and the historic old town, and has direct bus connections to all important part of the City.
