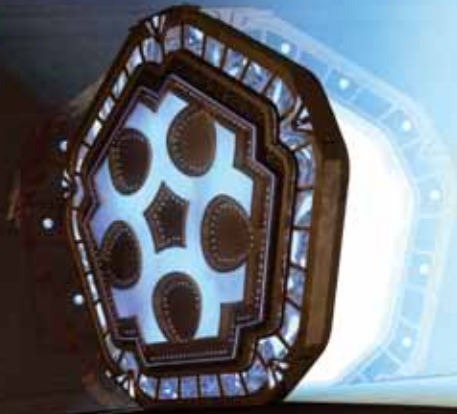

Find inspiration for your future career at the University of Canberra Open Day, Saturday 27 August.

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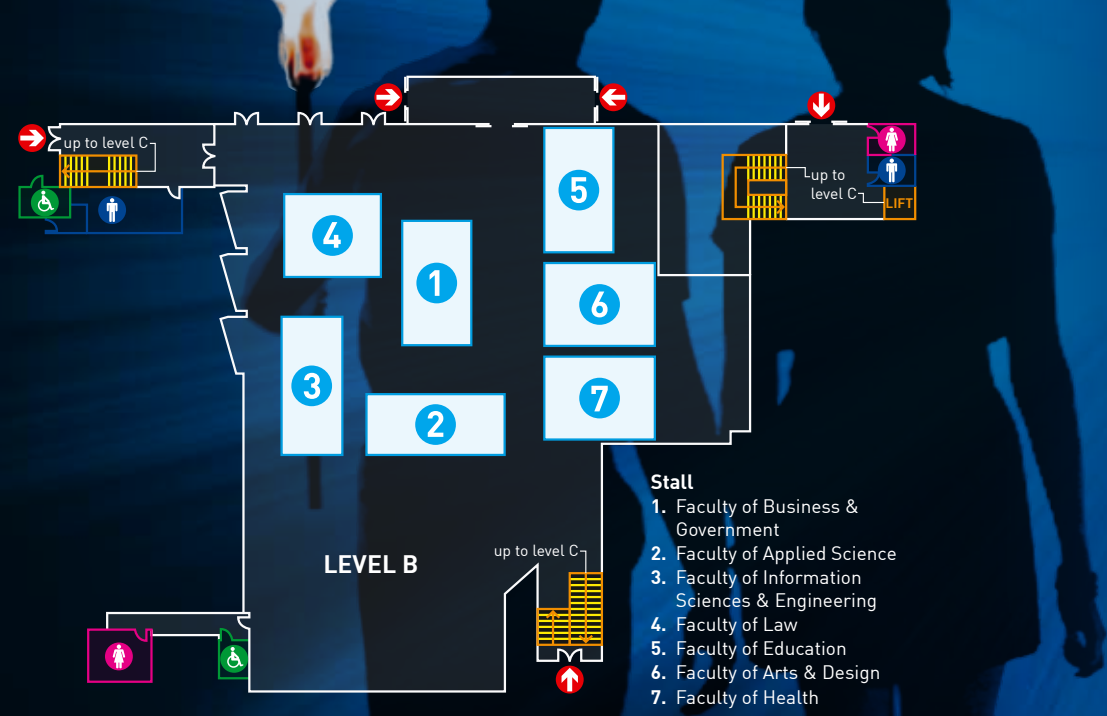
ACADEMIC EXPO

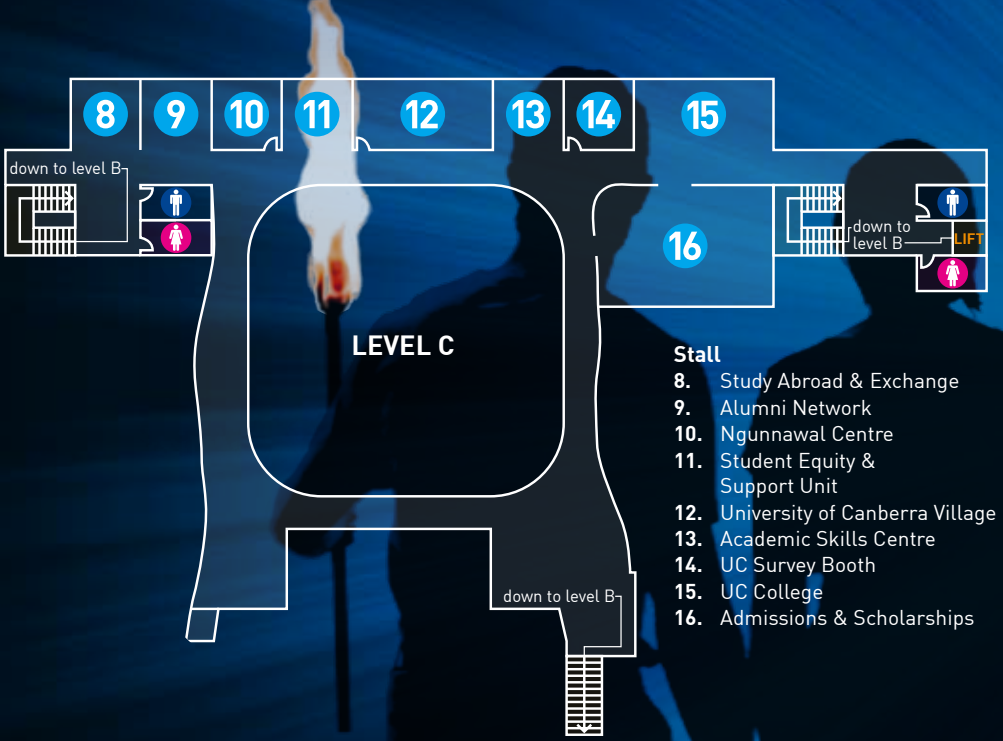

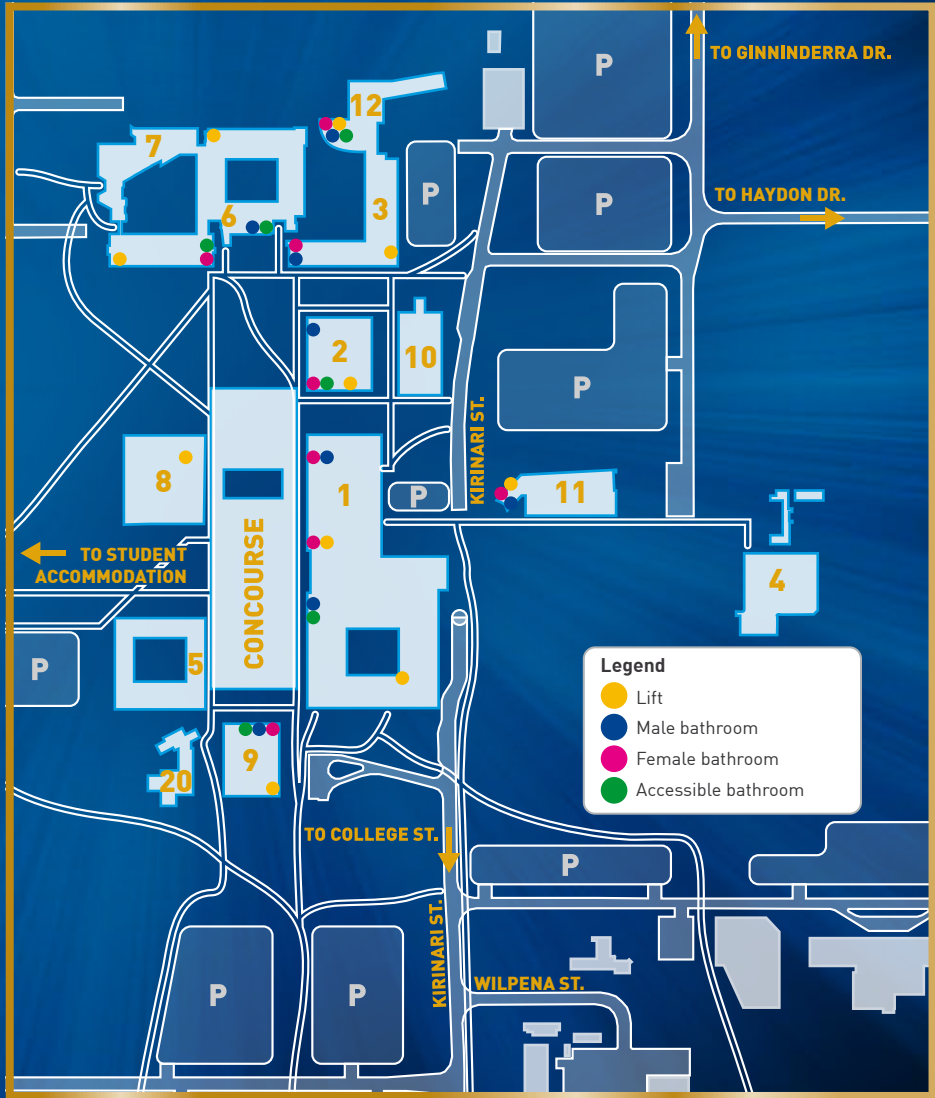
ENTERTAINMENT
