

DISABILITY STANDARDS FOR EDUCATION (DSE) E-LEARNING TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF USE

By accessing the DSE eLearning Materials you agree to be bound by these terms of use. In these Terms of Use, a reference to “we” and “us” means University of Canberra ABN 81 633 873 422 (**UC**). A reference to “you” or “your” in these Terms is a reference to any person, accessing, reviewing or using the DSE eLearning currently located at <http://dse.theeducationinstitute.edu.au>

Confidentiality of Registration Key

The Registration Key is provided for the sole purpose of enabling you to register as a user on the DSE eLearning Management System. The Registration Key is confidential. You must not publish, share or distribute in any way the Registration Key. You will have no further need of the Registration Key once you have registered your user details on the DSE eLearning Management System. When you return to the site, you should log-in with your email address and password. Once you have used the Registration Key to register your account, you will have log-in access to the Disability Standards for Education (DSE) eLearning online until February 2018.

We reserve the right to disable your Registration Key at any time.

Your access to the DSE eLearning

By providing you with a Registration Key, we have granted you (and only you) a non-exclusive, non-transferable licence to use the DSE eLearning Materials until February 2018. This licence may not be assigned or sub-licensed.

You may access the DSE eLearning at any time, unless we have restricted access to undertake specific activities.
