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PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The UC Professional Experience program is an opportunity for preservice teachers to engage with professional educational communities in schools, early childhood education and care settings, and other educational settings. Professional Experience units place students in their relevant teaching areas to learn different aspects of professional practice within a diverse range of educational settings in local schools as placement. The completion of placement days is a requirement to course complete and register as a teacher within Australia, including the ACT Teachers Quality Institute (TQI) and the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA).

Please note, all professional experience placements are formally arranged by the University Placement Team. Students (preservice teachers) and/or members of their family should not make direct contact with teachers in schools to arrange placements.

THE PLACEMENT TEAM, CAREERS UC

The Placement Team supports the administration of professional experience placement at UC. This includes the management and coordination of compliance (pre-placement requirements) required to enable you to undertake professional placement. The Placement Team collaborates with Industry Partners and other professional bodies associated with professional placements. We will review your pre-placement requirements, allocate you to your placements and provide support to the disciplines in your professional learning.

Successful completion of your pre-placement requirements is a mandatory requirement of all Education courses with professional placements. We encourage you to begin now so that you do not miss out on any opportunities. Please visit our website for further <u>Placement</u> information.

PLANNING FOR YOUR PLACEMENT

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE SCHEDULES

The timing of professional experience will generally occur once the teaching period has finished for Teacher Education courses. This typically occurs from UC week 12 onwards in Sem 1 and Sem 2 and may overlap into Winter Term for some students.

Please refer to the 2024 Professional Experience <u>Calendars</u> for a complete overview of UC weeks, ACT/NSW school terms and available 'windows' for placement time.

GUIDELINES REGARDING SEQUENCE OF DAYS

- If you are unable to undertake your placement at the scheduled time/dates please submit an Extenuating Circumstances Application.
- Please contact lnclusion@canberra.edu.au if have a Reasonable Adjustment Plan, so that you can discuss a Placement Support Letter to be arranged, to enable reasonable adjustments for placements. Please contact the Placement Team to discuss the recommendations in the Support Letter.
- A placement is a full day at school, including 30 minutes before lessons start and 60 minutes after lesson conclude. This may be negotiated with individual schools, depending on meetings and before or after school activities.
- No more than 2 days adjustment to your placement days may be negotiated directly with the school.
- Follow school procedure for calling in sick (as determined at your initial school meeting).
 Provide a medical certificate to your Mentor if this is school policy, notify the Placement
 Team of your absence via <u>placements@canberra.edu.au</u> and include a medical certificate.
- Note that you are required to make up missed days.
- Missing university classes to attend placement is not permitted.

EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES APPLICATION

If you are not able to attend your placement in your designated block you may be eligible to apply for an <u>Extenuating Circumstances Application</u>.

Please note that there are conditions for approval for your ECA:

- Representation: sport, representation for UC
- Service Commitments: Voluntary Military or Emergency Service Commitments
- Legal Appearance: Jury duty or court mandated appearances
- Birth or Adoption: student or partner due to give birth, adopt a child
- Cultural or Religious: religious or cultural activities that prevent undertaking placement
- Reasonable Adjustment: health condition requiring specialised/ongoing treatment

Please note holidays, weddings and travel will not be approved. You must attend in your placement block unless you meet the requirements above.

Please submit this application no later than 10 weeks before your placement block. A date for final submissions of ECAs will be posted as an ATES announcement.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE OUTSIDE OF CANBERRA

Schools in Queanbeyan, Jerrabomberra, Googong, Bungendore, Murrumbateman, Sutton and Gundaroo are deemed as Canberra Region schools. Any schools further than this are Outside of Canberra Region (such as Cooma, Goulburn and Yass).

From time to time, opportunities arise for Preservice Teachers to undertake professional experience outside of the ACT and surrounding region.

This offer will be open to **Intermediate and Final level** placement Preservice Teachers who have successfully completed their Observation and Beginner placements in the Canberra Region. Students must have a sound academic history, have achieved satisfactory professional experience reports, and do not have a <u>conflict of interest</u> at their possible school and have not previously undertaken a professional experience outside the Canberra region. <u>Think Regional: Professional Experience Outside of Canberra Region.</u> Individual considerations may be sort from students who live interstate or who are studying remotely. These need to be directed to the <u>School Placement Lead</u>.

Please submit this application no later than 10 weeks before your placement block. A date for final submissions of COIs and OOCRs will be posted as an ATES announcement.

MEETING YOUR PRE-PLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS

Review the <u>No Stress Placement Planner</u> to ensure that you meet your all pre-placements requirements before you commence your first placement this year.

It is very important to complete all professional experience documents to meet the requirements of placement units; failing to complete these may impact the successful completion of your school-based practical which is an essential component in this course.

THE PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE REPORT

The professional experience report is a legal document that exist for two reasons; to provide a detailed and accurate representation of the Preservice teacher's placement and to act as evidence of practicum days completed by the Preservice teacher (PST).

Interim Feedback

Throughout the professional experience, PSTs will receive regular oral and written feedback informing them of their strengths and weaknesses. PSTs must be made aware of any aspects of performance that need to be improved as soon as they arise, allowing the PST maximum time to make the necessary improvements. To this end, all placements over 10 days duration **require a formative assessment** be carried out.

It is required that at a point in time, usually halfway through the professional experience period, the Mentoring Teacher (MT) complete a copy of the report as a means of reflecting on the progress of the PST. This Interim feedback is to be uploaded by the PST onto their respective Professional Experience Unit UCLearn (Canvas) site. This formative report is not intended to be a time-consuming onerous task, rather a discussion and reflection together with the PST to enable a shared understanding of demonstrated strengths and areas in need of improvement. This is an appropriate time for indications of 'Intervention and Support' to be reported. A suitable complementary strategy is for the PST to complete his/her own formative report as a means of reflecting and sharing progress.

Summative Assessment

The **final report** is to be written on the final day of the professional experience (or within a reasonable time frame) and then submitted to the to the University as per the instructions on the front page of the report. The report should reflect the PST's demonstrated level of performance and must clearly articulate areas of strength as well as highlight areas for improvement. It must also be signed by all co-signatories prior to being submitted to the Placement Team.

Procedure for Report Submission

Review <u>instructions</u> on completing the electronic Professional Experience Report. On completion, submit a signed (school-based signatures as well as your own) electronic <u>Final Professional</u> <u>Experience Report</u> to <u>placements@canberra.edu.au</u> within one week of completing the placement.

PLACEMENT- FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS)

The following are frequently asked questions concerning placements and graduation.

FAQ Preservice Teachers
