Graduands will be presented individually by the Executive Dean to receive their testamur, in order of level of degree, from the Chancellor


A representative of the student body will deliver a congratulatory speech.

In his speech that day, Sir John invited his audience to not simply aspire to greatness, but also to prepare for, practice for and make ready for their own successes. In his words,



DR WARREN MCDONALD

SPORTS PHYSICIAN AND EDUCATOR

Throughout his career as a Sports and Exercise Physician, Dr Warren McDonald has worked with several esteemed organisations. He has been involved in professional rugby for over 20 years and has lectured at the University of Canberra throughout that time.

Warren graduated from the University of NSW with a Bachelor of Science in 1984. He completed a Bachelor of Medicine/Bachelor of Surgery in 1986 and in 1992, was admitted as a Fellow of the College of Sport and Exercise Medicine. Warren took up a position as an Adjunct Senior Lecturer in Sports Medicine at the University of Canberra in 1996. In 2007 he became an Adjunct Associate Professor, a position he remains in today.

Warren began working at the Australian Institute of Sport in 1990, working as a doctor to elite athletes preparing for international competitions. During his 11 years at the AIS he worked and travelled with Australian senior and junior national teams, including basketball, water polo and swimming, to various international competitions, including world championships, and both the Atlanta and Sydney Olympic Games as team doctor. Warren left the AIS after the 2000 Sydney Olympics to co-found Sports Physicians ACT in 2001, a private sports medicine clinic in Canberra which he has run for the past 19 years. In his roles at the AIS and in private practice he was responsible for the teaching and mentoring of numerous registrars and other trainees in sports medicine.

In 1999 Warren commenced working with the ACT Brumbies as Medical Director and team doctor, and in 2008 commenced as Wallabies team doctor. In 2010 he was appointed Chief Medical Officer of the Australian Rugby Union, responsible for the structures and management of medical systems across all programs managed by the Australian Rugby Union (now Rugby Australia). He has combined his love of teaching with this role and has rolled out World Rugby's Immediate Care courses across Australia and the Pacific, as a World Rugby Medical Educator, Trainer and Course Director.

These Immediate Care courses teach doctors, physiotherapists, nurses, sports trainers and volunteers who assist in rugby both in Australia and around the world. He is also an educator on Immediate Care courses run by the Australasian College of Sport and Exercise Medicine.

Warren has been the recipient of awards for his services to sports medicine, including The Australian Sports Medal and the ACT Rugby Union Garry Quinlivan Service Award.

Warren is a serving board member of the ACT Physical Activity Foundation, the World Rugby Medical Commission, SANZAAR Medical Commission and is Chair of the Oceania Rugby Medical and Injury Prevention Group.

In addition to his lecturer position at the University of Canberra, Warren regularly participates in research projects within the Faculty of Health, Discipline of Sport and Exercise Science, and has been key in facilitating networks between Rugby Australia, World Rugby and the University.

It is for his distinguished career as a sports physician and educator, his excellent reputation within the sporting and rugby communities, and his contribution to the University that Warren is being awarded an Honorary Doctorate by the University of Canberra.

KAREN MIDDLETON

POLITICAL JOURNALIST

Intrepid, tenacious and driven by a strong social conscience, prominent political journalist Karen Middleton has spent more than 30 years reporting on national and international affairs for print and broadcast media.

In 1987, Karen graduated from the Canberra College of Advanced Education (now the University of Canberra) with a Bachelor of Arts in Professional Writing. Karen is the Chief Political Correspondent for The Saturday Paper, a role she has held since 2016.

Also a radio and television commentator, Karen is a regular contributor to ABC radio and appears on programs including The Drum and Q&A. She has been a panellist on ABC TV's Insiders since its inception in 2001 and is a guest commentator on the Ten Network's The Project. She is also a correspondent for Radio New Zealand and Monocle24 Radio UK and has provided news, commentary and analysis for the BBC, the New York Times , CNBC and other international networks and publications.

Karen's print career began at The Canberra Times in 1984, first as a copy person and then as a freelance arts contributor. The journalism cadetship she undertook while still studying full-time at UC involved a stint in the Federal Parliamentary Press Gallery, where she discovered a passion for politics. Karen returned to the Press Gallery permanently in 1989 when she joined the Melbourne Herald . She worked then for the daily and Sunday Herald-Sun, before joining The Age's parliamentary bureau in 1992. Five years later, she became the Political Editor for The West Australian.

In 2005, Karen stepped into what would become a decade-long role as the Chief Political Correspondent and Canberra Bureau Chief for SBS Television, during which time she also renewed her relationship with The Canberra Times as a weekly columnist.

From 2005 to 2008, Karen served as president of the Federal Parliamentary Press Gallery, and in 2008 was awarded a Churchill Fellowship to investigate the role and operation of parliamentary press galleries in four comparable democracies: the U.S. Canada, Great Britain and Ireland.

With her journalist colleagues, Karen was in Washington DC on September 11, 2001, covering the official visit to the US of then-Australian Prime Minister John Howard, when terrorists struck the World Trade Centre in New York and the Pentagon in the US capital.

As events unfolded, she made her way to New York to report on the aftermath. The experience forged a deep interest in security policy and in 2007 she took up the opportunity to report directly from Afghanistan for SBS, travelling with the Australian Defence Force. She undertook two more media embeds there in 2011 and 2012.

Karen's proximity to the events of 9/11 inspired her first book, An Unwinnable War: Australia in Afghanistan (2011), which laid out the political backstory to Australia's involvement in what became the nation's longest military conflict. She followed this up in 2016 with a biography that revealed the personal story of Labor frontbencher and now Opposition Leader Anthony Albanese.

It is for her outstanding career in journalism, and contributions from both within Australia and abroad, that Karen Middleton is being awarded an Honorary Doctorate by the University of Canberra.

PROFESSOR PAUL SMITH

DIRECTOR OF ORTHOPAEDIC SURGERY

Professor Paul Smith has been a leading figure in orthopaedic surgery in Australia, with particular impact in Canberra.

Paul is the Director of Orthopaedic Surgery at The Canberra Hospital where he specialises in orthopaedic and trauma surgery, primary and revision joint replacement, and surgery of the knee, hip and pelvis.

Graduating from Flinders University in 1986 with a Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery, Professor Smith completed his orthopaedic surgical training in 1995. Following fellowships in adult joint replacement in London Ontario, and at Princess Elizabeth Orthopaedic Centre in Exeter UK, he returned to Canberra in 1998 to take up a full-time clinical position.

His influence in the field of health in the ACT can be seen through his current role at The Canberra Hospital, in his scope as Professor of Orthopaedics at the ANU Medical School and as incumbent chairman of the ACT branch of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. In the not-for-profit space, Professor Smith is Chairman of the John James Foundation, the largest health charitable foundation in the ACT with total assets under investment of over \$120 million.

Professor Smith is the only Australian surgeon to have been awarded the International Knee Society Insall Fellowship – this in recognition of his work in understanding knee joint kinematics in health, injury and arthritis. His international standing with respect to hip and pelvic fracture injury reconstruction has been recognised by the receipt of the International Consensus Fellowship in Pelvic surgery, invited lectureships and through his work as a journal editor.

He is past president of the Arthroplasty Society of Australia, and a director of the Australian Orthopaedic Association Research Foundation. In 2019, Professor Smith received the Australian Orthopaedic Association award for Service to Orthopaedic Research.

Paul's belief in evidence-based practice is demonstrated by his commitment to research and incorporating new evidence in his ongoing clinical practice. In his clinical world, Professor Smith is one of Australia's most experienced joint replacement surgeons and over the past 20 years has performed over 5,000 hip and knee replacement procedures. At the same time, his patients remark on his kindness and compassion while his staff are constantly aware of his commitment to public health and public good. Professor Smith is passionate about research, teaching and training and improvements in equipment and techniques which translate to better outcomes for his patients.

Three honours students (Physiotherapy) and two medical students (ANU) have completed joint research projects between the University of Canberra and Paul's research unit. This research collaboration has resulted in almost 100 papers, and substantial research funding.

Paul led the establishment and ongoing management of the Trauma and Orthopaedic Research Unit at The Canberra Hospital and the John Curtin School of Medical Research, the ACT Bone Bank and the ACT Musculoskeletal and Orthopaedic Research Foundation. In his leadership roles as an orthopaedic surgeon, Director of Orthopaedic Surgery at The Canberra Hospital and ACT Chair of the Australian Orthopaedic Association, Professor Smith has been a powerful advocate for allied health and nursing higher degree by research (HDR) students and research.

It is for his distinguished career and outstanding contribution to the field of Orthopaedic surgery, that Professor Paul Smith is being awarded an Honorary Doctorate by the University of Canberra.

OUR TRADITIONS

GRADUATE GOWNS

Today's academic dress developed from the clothing worn by the monks in medieval times. The monks and pupils taking instruction wore habits or long gowns with a cowl (a hood and elbow-length cape), both indoors and outdoors, for extra warmth. Later, tonsured monks probably wore skull caps for the same reason.

At Oxford and Cambridge in the time of King Henry VIII statutes prescribed what style of academic dress could be worn, and the rules were strictly enforced. Materials and colours to be used for hoods to denote levels of scholarship were laid down, and later, colours for hood and gown trimmings to indicate particular branches of learning came into use.

Academic dress for the University consists of a black cloth academic gown, black trencher and hood. The dress for a degree of Doctor is a royal blue gown with gold facings and a black bonnet. The level of award is distinguished by the colours of the hood linings, rather than by colours for different branches of learning. This carries on the tradition established by CCAE.

CEREMONIAL GOWNS

The gowns of the Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor seek to celebrate Canberra. These gowns feature the floral emblem of the Australian Capital Territory, the Royal Bluebell or Wahlenbergia Gloriosa, on a decorative braid. The embroidery showcases the natural, deep-blue shades of the Royal Bluebell with dark green stems and leaves. Both gowns are the traditional black; the Chancellor's gown features gold trimmings and the Vice-Chancellor can be distinguished by silver trimmings.

The design for the braid was developed locally by Ms Judith Rosenberg from sketches by Dr Dianne Firth, a University of Canberra staff member. The braid was made by a local craftsperson, Ms Sharon Peoples. The Royal Bluebell is found in the high forests and woodlands (above 1,300 metres) of the ACT, south-eastern NSW and eastern Victoria.

The Chair of Academic Board and Division Marshals wear black gowns with bands of deep blue embroidered braid, and a hood lined in deep blue. Council members now wear an adaptation of the former CCAE's purple gowns, as a salute to our history.

ACADEMIC PROCESSION GOWNS

The Academic Procession is rich with different styles and colours of academic gowns.

Members wear regalia that represents their highest level of qualification, from the institution through which this study was undertaken.





THE UNIVERSITY STAR

Our emblem, the C-Star, is derived from the CCAE's original purpose, which was to provide education in the five fields of science, technology, art, administration and commerce. These five broad areas are embodied through the five interlocking "C's". The C-Star represents Canberra and the interdisciplinary nature of our courses and also the essential character of each field of endeavour. It was designed in 1969 by Derek Wrigley, on commission by the CCAE Council.

THE CHANCELLOR'S CHAIR

The Chancellor's chair was a gift from the Australian National University, marking the inauguration of the University of Canberra in 1990. This ceremonial item was crafted at the Canberra Institute of the Arts. The chair's back proudly bears the University's emblem, the C-Star.

Traditionally, only the Chancellor or their representative may be seated on this chair. This ceremonial item marks the solemnity of our Graduation Ceremonies and represents our emergence as a global educational institution. It provides a link between our past success as CCAE, the recognition of our achievements from our peers and our continued success as the University of Canberra.

MACE

The Mace is carried by the Secretary of Council. The Mace was presented by the ACT Government in 1991, as a symbol of institutional authority. Traditionally the Mace is carried as a ceremonial weapon designed to protect the Chancellor, the University, its people and its processes. It was also crafted at the Canberra Institute of the Arts.

PROCESSIONAL STAFF

The Processional Staff is carried by the Chair of Academic Board. It was presented to the University by its Association of Academic Staff. It was made of wood from a local Casuarina tree and embellished with silver, and was crafted at the Canberra Institute of the Arts to harmonise with the Mace. The jarrah stand on which the staff rests was crafted and donated in 2012 by former University of Canberra staff member, Peter Hill.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF CULTURES

We recognise and respect the unique cultures and contributions that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples bring to our community. We acknowledge the cultures of our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander graduates during ceremonies through an optional ceremonial stole which incorporates the colours of the respective flags.


