

CALLEO INDIGENOUS SCHOLARSHIP

Conditions of Award

Purpose of the Scholarship

This Scholarship aims to support disadvantaged Indigenous students studying in their second year of an undergraduate degree in any field at the University of Canberra's Bruce Campus.

Scholarship Details

The Scholarship shall be known as the Calleo Indigenous Scholarship.

The Scholarship is funded by Calleo Indigenous Pty Ltd.

Eligibility

The Scholarship is open for consideration for Indigenous student(s) enrolled in the second year of an undergraduate degree at the University of Canberra Bruce Campus achieving a minimum overall academic performance of 65% (credit). Applicants must also be able to demonstrate financial need, leadership, community engagement or volunteer work and other barriers or challenges they have faced.

Application

Details on how to apply for the Calleo Indigenous Scholarship, including opening and closing dates, will be advertised on the Scholarship webpage (https://www.canberra.edu.au/scholarships). Payments will be made as soon as possible after census date.

Students are expected to apply only once through the Application portal available through the Scholarships website. Applicants must answer each question in the application form truly and to the best of their knowledge at the time of applying. Any major change in the application must be conveyed to the Scholarships Office at Scholarships@canberra.edu.au before the closing date. After this date, applications will be considered based on the original application. In case of multiple applications, the latest application will be considered.

Selection

The committee will consider the following parameters in the application form:

- 40% Demonstrated financial need
- 20% Demonstrated barriers or challenges
- 40% Demonstrated leadership roles, work experience, community engagement or volunteer work

The Scholarships Office will prepare a shortlist of applications who meet the criteria and provide this to the Scholarships committee. The Committee reviews applications and ranks these according to the parameters of the scholarship. The Scholarships Office will collate all the information and submit the Committee's recommendations for approval. A final check of eligibility is completed after the census date prior to awarding the Scholarships.

Number of Scholarships

Two Scholarships will be awarded each year. The Committee reserves the right not to offer an award/to offer an award at any time to an eligible person.

Value and Tenure of the Scholarship

The value of each scholarship is determined by Calleo Indigenous Pty Ltd and is currently valued at \$15,000. The scholarship value is paid in equal instalments of \$2,500 over 6 semesters. The Scholarship money is paid after the census date via Electronic Funds transfer.

Enrolment Conditions

The recipient must be, and remain, enrolled as a full-time student in an undergraduate program for the Scholarship to remain active. In the event of change of degree, intermission or discontinuation, the student must notify the Scholarships Office at Scholarships@canberra.edu.au. If a student is found ineligible with regards to enrolment or unsatisfactory academic results in the previous semester, the Scholarship may be rescinded.

Recipient Conditions

The recipients are advised that information relevant to the scholarship will be shared between the University of Canberra and the Donor in order to administer the scholarship. Recipients must adhere to the University of Canberra's policies and procedures. Recipients must agree to their academic progress being made known to the scholarship donor.

The recipients are encouraged to liaise and meet with the donor of their Scholarship and provide a brief summary of how the Scholarship assisted them with their studies as directed by the Scholarships Office when required. The Scholarship recipient is also encouraged to participate in publicity for the scholarships from time to time. Recipients may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the Scholarships by publishing the names of the scholars. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through the either the Scholarships Office, Advancement Office or Marketing Office.

Providing False or Misleading Information

The awarding of a scholarship/grant is based on the information provided to the University. An award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false or misleading information is provided or relevant information is withheld. This includes circumstances where the false information is unrelated to the assessment in awarding the scholarship/grant.

Deferment

The Scholarship cannot be deferred.
