

ELDON AND ANNE FOOTE ELITE ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP

Conditions of Award

Purpose of the Scholarship

This Scholarship aims to support high performing Elite Athletes studying at the University of Canberra Bruce Campus, who demonstrate commitment to their sport and financial need.

Scholarship Details

The Scholarship shall be known as the Eldon and Anne Foote Elite Athlete Scholarship

This Scholarship is funded by The Lord Mayor's Charitable Foundation as the Trustee for the Eldon and Anne Foote Trust.

Eligibility

The Scholarship is open for consideration for domestic undergraduate and postgraduate coursework degree students studying at the Bruce campus. Students must be recognised as Elite Athletes at the University as determined by the Elite Athlete Friendly University (EAFU) guidelines. Students must also demonstrate contribution to sport through leadership, volunteer roles or community work as well as financial need.

Application

Details on how to apply for the Eldon and Anne Foote Elite Athlete Scholarship, including opening and closing dates, will be advertised on the Scholarship webpage (<https://www.canberra.edu.au/scholarships>). Payments will be made as soon as possible after census date.

Students are expected to apply only once through the Application portal available through the Scholarships website. Applicants must answer each question in the application form truly and to the best of their knowledge at the time of applying. Any major change in the application must be conveyed to the Scholarships Office at Scholarships@canberra.edu.au before the closing date. After this date, applications will be considered based on the original submission. In case of multiple applications, the latest application will be considered.

Selection

The committee will consider the following parameters in the application form:

- 65% Sporting achievement and excellence at the highest level (as recognised by the Elite Athlete Friendly University (EAFU) Guidelines.
- 25% Demonstrated financial need.
- 10% Demonstrated contribution to sport through leadership, volunteer roles or community work.

The Scholarships Office will prepare a shortlist of applications who meet the criteria and provide this to the Scholarships committee. The Committee reviews applications and ranks these according to the parameters of the

scholarship. The Scholarships Office will collate all the information and submit the Committee's recommendations for approval. A final check of eligibility is completed after the census date prior to awarding the Scholarships.

Number of Scholarships

10 scholarships will be awarded each year. The Committee reserves the right not to offer an award/to offer an award at any time to an eligible person.

Value and Tenure of the Scholarship

The value of each scholarship is determined by The Lord Mayor's Charitable Foundation as the Trustee for the Eldon and Anne Foote Trust and the University of Canberra. Scholarships are currently valued \$10,000. Scholarship funds are allocated by the Selection Committee based on the above selection criteria.

Recipients receiving \$10,000 in scholarship funds will be paid in 2 equal instalments of \$5,000 over 2 main semesters.

Scholarship funds are paid after the census date via Electronic Funds transfer.

Enrolment Conditions

The recipient must be enrolled as a full-time or part-time student after the census date in an undergraduate or postgraduate coursework degree at the University of Canberra Bruce campus for the Scholarship to be awarded.

Recipient Conditions

Recipients are advised that information relevant to the scholarship will be shared between the University of Canberra and the Donor to administer the scholarship. Recipients must adhere to the University of Canberra's policies and procedures. Recipients must agree to their academic progress being made known to the scholarship donor.

Recipients are encouraged to liaise and meet with the Donor and provide a brief summary of how the Scholarship assisted them with their studies as directed by the Scholarships Office when required. Recipients are also encouraged to participate in publicity for the scholarships from time to time. Recipients may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the Scholarships by publishing the names of the scholars. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through either the Scholarships Office, Advancement Office, or Marketing Office.

Providing False or Misleading Information

The awarding of a scholarship/grant is based on the information provided to the University. An award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false or misleading information is provided or relevant information is withheld. This includes circumstances where the false information is unrelated to the assessment in awarding the scholarship/grant.

Deferment

The Scholarship cannot be deferred.

Taxation and Centrelink

Recipients are responsible for seeking taxation and Centrelink advice regarding their own individual circumstances. Scholarships/grants may be regarded as taxable income if a recipient is enrolled on a part-time basis.
