

First in Family Student Accommodation Scholarship

Conditions of Award

Purpose of the Scholarship

This Scholarship aims to support students who are the first in their family to attend university. This scholarship will provide financial support to students to enable them to successfully engage in their study at the University of Canberra, while being accommodated in a safe, secure and accessible student residence.

Scholarship Details

The Scholarship is known as the First in Family Student Accommodation Scholarship and is funded by Student Life, the University of Canberra.

Threshold Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the Scholarship, applicants **must** satisfy all of the following threshold criteria.

Applicants must be:

- a) an Australian citizen, permanent resident or permanent humanitarian visa holder;
- b) an undergraduate student at the University of Canberra;
- c) the first member of their immediate family, including siblings, to attend university; and
- d) residing at one of the University of Canberra student residences when the next teaching period commences.

Students may re-apply for this Scholarship each Semester, however, priority may be given to commencing students.

Application

Applications are submitted via the [Scholarship webpage](#), which provides details including opening and closing dates. Applications should review the [Terms and Definitions page](#) and **must** confirm that all threshold eligibility criteria are met before applying.

To be considered for this Scholarship, applicants must ensure the following sections of the application are completed correctly in addition to their personal details. Applications submitted without the required supporting documentation outlined below (where applicable) may not be considered.

<i>Would you like to be considered for a scholarship based on financial need and equity?</i>	Select 'Yes' to the question and complete the follow-up questions including the statement

<i>Will you be residing in on campus accommodation during the next semester?</i>	Select 'Yes' and provide the name of your accommodation provider.
Personal statements section	
Provide a statement (maximum 500 words) addressing what impact you hope your university education will have on your future or your community.	
Additional information section	
<i>Additional documents</i>	<p>Upload proof of residency in on-campus accommodation (e.g. rental contract, driver's licence or official letter showing your address).</p> <p>If you have not previously lived on campus, attach a copy of your accommodation offer.</p> <p>It is strongly recommended that you provide supporting documentation to demonstrate your financial hardship. For more information on the types of documentation that may be submitted, please refer to the Terms and Definitions page.</p>

Applicants may apply once through the Scholarship website. Multiple applications for different scholarships are only permitted if additional space is needed for scholarship-specific personal statements.

All questions in the application form must be answered truthfully and to the best of the applicant's knowledge at the time of submission. Applicants are encouraged to complete all written responses in their own words. Submissions that sound personal and draw on real experiences may be viewed more favourably than those that appear to be AI-generated.

Any significant changes to the application must be communicated to the Scholarships Office at scholarships@canberra.edu.au before the closing date. After this date, applications will be assessed based on the original version. Where multiple applications are received for the same scholarship, the most recent submission will be considered.

Selection

The Scholarship Committee will assess applications under the following criteria:

- 50% - Financial hardship (statement and supporting evidence)
- 50% - A personal statement addressing what impact the applicant hopes their university education will have on their future or community.

The Scholarships Office will shortlist eligible applications for consideration by the Committee, which will review and rank them in accordance with the selection criteria of the Scholarship. The Committee's recommendations will be submitted to Director, Student Connect for approval. After the census date, a final enrolment eligibility check will be undertaken before confirming the award and arranging payment of funds.

Number of Scholarships

Ten (10) Scholarships may be awarded each Semester. The University reserves the right not to offer the Scholarship or to award it at any time to an eligible person.

Value and Tenure of the Scholarship

The Scholarship is currently valued at \$5,000 per student. The scholarship is credited directly to the student's account with the accommodation provider after the census date. The money is not refundable and cannot be credited to the recipient if they withdraw from their studies or leave their university accommodation.

Enrolment Conditions

The recipient must be enrolled after the census date for the Scholarship to be awarded.

Recipient Conditions

Information relevant to the Scholarship will be shared between the University of Canberra and the Donor for the purpose of administering the Scholarship. The recipient must adhere to the University's policies and procedures and agree to the disclosure of their academic progress to the Donor.

Recipients are encouraged to meet with the Donor and to provide a brief written summary of their how the Scholarship assisted them with their studies. Scholarship-related publicity may also be requested from time to time, including interviews and photographs. The University may also publicise the Scholarship by publishing the names of recipients. Arrangements for such publicity will be coordinated through the Scholarships, Advancement or Marketing Office.

Students are also encouraged to sign up for a financial planning session to ensure they can pay the remainder of their fees and engage with a Student Success Coordinator for Student Success Coaching throughout their first year of study.

The recipients must adhere to the terms of their Student Occupancy Agreement.

Concurrent Scholarships

Recipients may not usually be permitted to hold this scholarship concurrently with other scholarships.

Providing False or Misleading Information

The awarding of a scholarship/grant is based on the information provided to the University. An award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false or misleading information is provided or relevant information is withheld.

Deferment

The Scholarship cannot be deferred.

Taxation and Centrelink

Recipients are responsible for seeking taxation and Centrelink advice regarding their own individual circumstances. Scholarships/grants may be regarded as taxable income if a recipient is enrolled on a part-time basis.
