

UNIVERSITY OF CANBERRA BATEMAN'S BAY YOUTH FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Conditions of Award

Purpose of the Scholarship

This Scholarship aims to support students enrolled at the University of Canberra Bruce Campus in an undergraduate coursework degree residing in or from North Eurobodalla Shire.

Scholarship Details

This Scholarship shall be known as the University of Canberra Bateman's Bay Youth Foundation Scholarship.

This Scholarship is funded by Bateman's Bay Youth Foundation (BBYF)

Eligibility

The Scholarship is open for consideration for domestic undergraduate students who are enrolled in an undergraduate coursework degree at the University of Canberra Bruce Campus. Applicants must also be residing in or from the North Eurobodalla Shire (North Durras to Nelligen to the north of Moruya River" but includes Moruya High School). Applicants must display a commitment to making a positive contribution to their community and financial hardship.

Application

Details on how to apply for the UC Batemans Bay Youth Foundation Scholarship, including opening and closing dates, will be advertised on the Scholarship webpage (https://www.canberra.edu.au/scholarships). Payments will be made as soon as possible after census date.

Students are expected to apply only once through the Application portal available through the Scholarships website. Applicants must answer each question in the application form truly and to the best of their knowledge at the time of applying. Any major change in the application must be conveyed to the Scholarships Office at Scholarships@canberra.edu.au before the closing date. After this date, applications will be considered based on the original application. In case of multiple applications, the latest application will be considered.

Selection

To be eligible to apply for the Scholarship, the applicant must be:

- An Australian citizen or permanent resident
- Enrolled in an undergraduate coursework degree at the University of Canberra Bruce Campus
- Be residing in or from the North Eurobodalla Shire (North Durras to Nelligen to the north of Moruya River", but includes Moruya High School)
- Display a commitment to making a positive contribution to their community.
- Able to demonstrate financial need

The Scholarships Office will prepare a shortlist of applications who meet the criteria and provide this to the Scholarships committee. The Committee reviews applications and ranks these according to the parameters of the scholarship. The Scholarships Office will collate all the information and submit the Committee's recommendations for approval. A final check of eligibility is completed after the census date prior to awarding the Scholarships.

Number of Scholarships

Up to four Scholarships may be awarded each year, depending on the available funds. The Committee reserves the right not to offer an award/to offer an award at any time to an eligible person.

Value and Tenure of the Scholarship

The value of each scholarship is determined by the University of Canberra and is currently valued at \$3,500 paid in two instalments (\$3000 after census date and \$500 on successful completion of the first semester).

Enrolment Conditions

The recipient must be enrolled as a full-time or part-time student after the census date and during the term of the Scholarship.

Recipient Conditions

The recipients are advised that information relevant to the scholarship will be shared between the University of Canberra and the sponsor in order to administer the scholarship. Recipients should maintain a minimum of a pass average and adhere to the University of Canberra's undergraduate policies and procedures. Recipients must agree to their academic progress being made known to the scholarship donor.

The recipients are encouraged to liaise and meet with the donor of their Scholarship and provide a brief summary of how the Scholarship assisted them with their studies as directed by the Scholarships team when required. The Scholarship holder is also encouraged to participate in publicity for the scholarships from time to time. Scholars may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the Scholarships by publishing the names of the scholars. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through the either the UC Scholarships, Advancement or Marketing Office.

Providing False or Misleading Information

The awarding of a scholarship/grant is based on the information provided to the University. An award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false or misleading information is provided or relevant information is withheld. This includes circumstances where the false information is unrelated to the assessment in awarding the scholarship/grant.

Deferment

The Scholarship cannot be deferred.



Taxation and Centrelink

Recipients are responsible for seeking taxation and Centrelink advice regarding their own individual circumstances. Scholarships/grants may be regarded as taxable income if a recipient is enrolled on a part-time basis.
