

UC Sole Parent Scholarship

Conditions of Award

Purpose of the Scholarship

This Scholarship aims to support sole parents with responsibility of a child or children under the age of 18, to participate in full or part-time study for the semester.

Scholarship Details

The Scholarship shall be known as the UC Sole Parent Scholarship.

This Scholarship is funded by Student Life, University of Canberra.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Scholarship, the applicant must be a sole parent of a child or children under the age of 18 years.

Application

Details on how to apply for this Scholarship, including opening and closing dates, will be advertised on the <u>Scholarship webpage</u>. Payments will be made as soon as possible after census date.

Students are expected to apply only once through the Application portal available through the Scholarships website. Applicants must answer each question in the application form truly and to the best of their knowledge at the time of applying. Any major change in the application must be conveyed to the Scholarships Office at Scholarships@canberra.edu.au before the closing date. After this date, your application will be considered based on the original application. In case of multiple applications, the latest application will be considered.

Selection

The committee will consider the following parameters in the application form:

- 50% copy of child's birth certificate*
- 50% written statement indicating how the scholarship will assist the applicant's studies

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*Applicants must upload a copy of this documentation as an additional document at the end of the application form.

The Scholarships Office will prepare a shortlist of applications who meet the criteria and provide this to the Scholarship Committee. The Committee reviews applications and ranks these according to the parameters of the scholarship. The Scholarships Office will collate all the information and submit the Committee's recommendations for approval. A final check of eligibility is completed after the census date prior to awarding the Scholarships.

Number of Scholarships

One Scholarship may be awarded each Semester. The Committee reserves the right not to make an award or to make an award at any time to an eligible person.

Value and Tenure of the Scholarship

The Scholarship is currently valued at \$5,000 per student and paid as a one-off payment after the census date via Electronic Funds transfer.

Enrolment Conditions

The recipients must be enrolled in a minimum of 2 units at the university during the term of the scholarship and not be found in breach of the university's student conduct rules.

Recipient Conditions

The recipients are encouraged to liaise and meet with the donor of their Scholarship and provide a brief summary of how the Scholarship assisted them with their studies as directed by the Scholarships Office when required. The Scholarship holder is also encouraged to participate in publicity for the scholarships from time to time. Scholars may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the Scholarships by publishing the names of the scholars. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through either the UC Scholarships, Advancement or Marketing Office.

Subject to the information available at the time, the Pro Vice-Chancellor, Future Students may request that the payment for the semester in which the breach of conditions or withdrawal occurs be refunded in part or in full.

Providing False or Misleading Information

The awarding of a scholarship/grant is based on the information provided to the University. An award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false, or misleading information is provided or relevant information is withheld. This includes circumstances where the false information is unrelated to the assessment in awarding the scholarship/grant.



Deferment

The Scholarship cannot be deferred.

Taxation and Centrelink

The recipients are responsible for seeking taxation and Centrelink advice regarding their own individual circumstances. Scholarships/grants may be regarded as taxable income if a recipient is enrolled on a part-time basis.
