





Our Jobs on Campus program provides students with relevant, professional, paid work on campus. Students can work in roles including Student Ambassador, Library ASK Advisor, Food and Beverage Attendant, Communications Officer, Administration Assistant, Events Coordinator, and Data Entry Officer – just to name a few.

WORK INTEGRATED LEARNING

Work Integrated Learning (WIL) is central to our approach to education. Our WIL opportunities enhance our students' employability in the workplace and is an integral component of our courses. We strive to include Work Integrated Learning in all undergraduate courses, across every faculty, providing a variety of options for students'.

Field work is an approved activity that involves observing, collating information and/ or collecting data/ specimens.

WIL Project, or activity that engages individuals or teams to respond to a real-world problem or opportunity under the quidance of the faculty and client, or the faculty.

Placements or internships involve work experience (that takes place at the workplace) under the supervision of the faculty and the workplace supervisor.

Simulation, which can be a project or activity, involves authentic work experience that is undertaken in an simulated work environment, under the guidance of a supervisor. Simulation may be in the physical environment or virtual.



Domestic students can apply for a variety of private, government and internally funded scholarships to assist with study costs such as textbooks, accommodation and relocation costs. In most cases, students are selected following a competitive application process. Applying is easy — students can submit one application to be considered for every scholarship for which they're eligible.

International students have several government and internally funded scholarships available to them to assist with study costs and tuition fees. In most cases, students are automatically considered for internally funded international scholarships, but can apply for other scholarships offered in association with UC.

HOW TO APPLY

Current students

After browsing for available scholarships, click the 'Apply Now' button and you will be asked to sign in to MyUC. The application form is in 'Student Forms'. While applying for an externally funded scholarship, you will be redirected to their respective website.

Future students

Our scholarships are only available for students who have been offered or have accepted their place to study at UC. After browsing for available scholarships, click the 'Apply Now' button and you will be asked to apply for admission into a UC degree.

UC SPORT

Sporting clubs help UC students stay fit and healthy across sports including soccer, netball, rugby league, swimming, hockey, rugby union, athletics, cricket, AFL, table tennis, volleyball, gridiron and more. Each club has its own levels of commitment and skill, but many allow you to take part in university sporting events like Intervarsity, UniSport, Nationals and UniSport Nationals Snow.

- offering the Elite Athlete Program for UC students


Applying for elite athlete adjustment factors

Elite athletes or sporting coaches whose sporting commitments have affected their previous academic performance may be eligible for up to 5 adjustment factors towards their selection rank at LIC

In addition to a University Admissions Centre (UAC) admissions application, students will need to provide our Admissions Office with:

- their UAC application number
- a letter explaining how their sporting commitments affected their study in years 11 and 12
- a supporting statement from the relevant sporting body and the average hours per week spent training and competing

To be considered for adjustment factors, the above information must be emailed directly to **admissions@canberra.edu.au** after applying through the UAC.



The Elite Athlete Program

UC students pursuing sport at an elite level may be eligible for the Elite Athlete program. To be eligible, students need to:

- be a current UC Student
- be a member of one of the following organisations:
 - Australian Institute of Sport (AIS)
 - state or territory institute or academy of sports
 - professional players' association
 - National Sporting Organisation (NSO)
 - Sport Australia-funded national squad
 - Sport Australia-funded national team
 - UC Sport discretionary athlete.

As part of the program students may receive the following:

- a specialised orientation session during Orientation Week
- course advice and academic planning guidance
- advocacy within the university environment
- flexibility for assessment deadlines based on a students sporting commitments
- flexibility for attendance at lectures and tutorials (if practical) when a student is unavailable due to sporting commitments
- consideration for flexibility in the timing and location of attendance at Work Integrated Learning (WIL) Placements
- opportunity to apply for generous \$10,000 Eldon and Anne Foote Elite Athlete Scholarship
- support for cross-institutional studies where applicable
- the ability to tailor workload to a students sporting commitments
- the chance to extend the time a student has to complete course work
- the opportunity to take more than one leave of absence to support a students sporting commitments.
- free access to the UCFit! Gym for the Academic Year
- free exclusive UC Elite Athlete polo shirt

To apply for the program students will need to complete and submit the online Elite Athlete Support Program Application along with supporting documentation once they have accepted an offer to study at University of Canberra.

UC provides several equity and access programs across the student life cycle that enable the success of students from diverse backgrounds who may not have the opportunity to realise the benefits of higher education. Student Equity and Participation manage the delivery of several UC outreach, transition, participation and success initiatives, including a broad range of pre-access initiatives under its flagship outreach program, Aspire UC. Working with school and community partners across the ACT and regional NSW, Aspire UC aims to increase awareness of and inform aspirations for higher education, associated careers and pathways for students from backgrounds traditionally underrepresented in higher education.

For newly commencing students, Student Equity and Participation offers targeted one-to-one appointments, facilitating the development of a 'Student Success Action Plan'. The appointments include the opportunity to participate in the First Year Career Resilience and Success Program, offering careers advice, additional employability skills with access to part-time employment opportunities aligned with the students' career goals.

There are so many pathways out there it can get confusing knowing what to do and when. We've put together a rough timeline we tell students to follow when considering UC.

Year 10

You don't need to have your life mapped out yet, instead focus on exploring. Figure out what's out there and what you can be doing to make the most of your high school studies. Engage with UC with our Accelerated Pathways Program, Fast Forward Program, Holiday Short Courses and more.

Year 11

People are starting to ask you what your plans are right? It's okay if you're not sure yet. Consider your values and ambitions to determine which careers align most. Visit campuses, take tours, invite uni' reps to talk about pathways, and more.

Year 12

The countdown is on, and before you know it, you're going to be graduating! But what then? Start to plan your future now but don't try and tackle it all at once. Applying to university is a process and so you'll need that intrinsic driver to get you across the line, here's how:

January - April


The Recon Stage: Now's the time to start weeding out the competition and envisioning your future on campus. Follow your gut, it knows more than you know.

May - August

The Choice Stage: Now's the time to seriously compare courses, institutions, pathways, and even early offers. Start scripting your future, get specific.

September - December

The Call & Answer Stage: Now's the time to submit your University applications and wait for offers to come through.



ADJUSTMENT FACTORS

Adjustment factors are additional points that are added to your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) or entry rank to give you an adjusted entry score. The University of Canberra will increase your selection rank by a maximum of 20 points across the following categories.

Delivered by our on-campus education partner, the University of Canberra College (UC College) is dedicated to making students' dream to study at university a reality. UC College provides an alternative entry pathway to UC for students who may not have qualified for direct entry.

Centrally located on Bruce's campus, UC College students are welcome to utilise all on-campus services and facilities.

UC College provides students with a head-start in their studies through a range of Enabling and Higher Education Diploma Programs suited to both current school leavers and mature-age students.

The best bit? UC College provides students with a direct entry arrangement into UC in either the first or second year of the corresponding bachelor's degree.

Successfully completing one of our Academic Pathway Programs guarantees students a place at UC, and our highly qualified staff make sure students graduate from UC College with the necessary skills to take on a bachelor's degree.

If students have applied to UC directly but haven't received an offer, they will automatically receive an offer from UC College.

With these fantastic options, there's no need to panic if students have missed the selection rank cut off or did not receive an ATAR.

A student's pathway depends on course availability and the overall results they achieve. Students must pass all course unit requirements within the program to be guaranteed entry into University of Canberra. International applicants, please refer to UC College international entry requirements.

If your entry score falls outside these course requirements, your application may be considered on a case-by-case basis. Students will receive 24 credit points against their Bachelors degree unless otherwise stated.

SCHOOLS RECOMMENDATION SCHEME

Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS) are one way institutions make early offers of undergraduate admission to Year 12 students. They do this by using criteria other than (or in addition to) the ATAR.

WHO CAN APPLY?

To apply for SRS you must be a Year 12 applicant who is attempting:

- an Australian Year 12 qualification in 2023, or
- an International Baccalaureate in Australia in 2023.

You must also be a UAC applicant for undergraduate admission in 2023–24 and:

- an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or
- a permanent resident of Australia or holder of an Australian permanent resident humanitarian visa.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

Using your school's ratings of your aptitudes (including your capacity for tertiary study), the University of Canberra (UC) Schools Recommendation Scheme allows Year 12 students, who meet the requirements below, to receive early offers of undergraduate admission.

The University of Canberra Schools Recommendation Scheme does not guarantee entry. The University will set rating requirements for each course on the SRS list, which students must meet in order to be eligible to receive an offer. Many courses also have limited availability for SRS applicants.

How does it work?

To be eligible for the August Early Offer Round, students must be a current Year 12 student enrolled in a school located in the ACT or NSW and intending to go to university. For example, if a student is studying a tertiary package in the ACT, pursuing the HSC leading to an ATAR in NSW, or are undertaking the International Baccalaureate (IB), they can apply for admission to the University of Canberra in advance of receiving their ATAR results, which will instead be based on their Year 11 results and a personal statement. Students applying through the August Early Offer round are not excluded from submitting applications for the main UAC offer rounds based on their ATAR.

When applying for the August Early Offer Round, students' achieved results from the relevant Year 11 subjects will be assessed by UC. 'Relevant subjects' are 'T' or 'H' subjects in the ACT, specific HSC subjects that are used for the ATAR calculation [N1] in NSW, and subjects undertaken in Year 11 through the International Baccalaureate (IB) which are used to calculate your ATAR.

An overall percentage of at least 60%* or a Grade Point Average of at least 3/5 in Year 11 is required to be considered for admission through the August Early Offer Round. Students will also need to achieve an overall percentage or Grade Point Average in Year 11 that matches the selection rank of their preferred UC degree, as outlined in the table below.

Who is eligible?

To be eligible to apply for the August Early Offer Round at UC, students must be:

- intending to go to university, which can be demonstrated by undertaking a tertiary package in the ACT or pursuing the HSC leading to an ATAR in NSW, or undertaking the International Baccalaureate (IB)
- enrolled in a school in the ACT or NSW.




