

The AE curriculum ensures skill development in academic literacy and proficiency, so students are appropriately prepared for university studies in Australia. Successful completion of the AE course enables students to use English in a variety of academic contexts and to take responsibility for their own learning.

Successful completion of AE2 qualifies students for entry into the Univeristy of Canberra International Foundation Studies and most UC College diploma courses. No further IELTS testing is required.

 AE3 – Entry into AE3 is an overall IELTS of 5.5 (or equivalent) or successful completion of AE2

Successful completion of AE3 qualifies students for entry into most University of Canberra undergraduate degrees with standard entry requirements. No further IELTS testing is required.

AE4 – Entry into AE4 is an overall IELTS of 6.0 (or equivalent) or successful completion of AE3

Successful completion of AE4 qualifies students for entry into most University of Canberra postgraduate degrees and undergraduate degrees with higher than standard entry requirements to a maximum overall IELTS of 7.0 or equivalent. No further IELTS testing is required.

HOW DO I APPLY?

STEP 1 - APPLICATION PROCESS

- Direct application: please visit canberra.edu.au/apply and apply via the online application form
- 2. UC contracted Education Agents: please apply via the StudyLink Agent Portal
- **3. Navitas contracted Education Agents:** forward all application documents to **ucc.admissions@canberra.edu.au**

Certified copies of English qualifications and academic transcripts (translated into English) must accompany all applications.

STEP 2 - ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF APPLICATION

You will receive an email to acknowledge that your application has been received. Subsequently, should you be successful, you will receive an email containing your letter of offer with details of your course and required fees.

STEP 3 - ACCEPTING AN OFFER

An offer can be accepted online through the application portal. For students with a provisional or conditional offer, you will need to meet the conditions of that offer before you can accept. Once conditions have been met, please pay the amount showing on the offer to secure your place.

Payments must be made through the Western Union Business Solutions online payment portal. It is a safe and fast payment method that allows you to pay in your local currency. Be sure to reference your UC student ID number during the transfer.

STEP 4 - GETTING YOUR STUDENT VISA

Once we receive your acceptance form and confirmation of payment, you will be issued with a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE). This is required for your student visa application.

To apply for a student visa, you must meet the Genuine Temporary Entrant (GTE) requirements and lodge your application via the Department of Home Affairs website: **homeaffairs.gov.au**

For applicants applying via a registered agent or education advisors, they will be able to assist you with these procedures.

As part of the enrolment requirements, student visa holders are required by the conditions of their visa to study full-time for the duration of their course.

OVERSEAS STUDENT HEALTH COVER

It is compulsory that all international students studying in Australia are required to have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the length of their visa.
