Admission requirements

Admission to this course is based on an entrance rank. A rank can be achieved by the following means:

- Year 12 ATAR

If applicants do not have any of the above qualifications to attain an entrance rank, successful completion of an Australian Year 12, with the following, will be considered:

- ACT: Minimum of 3 C's
- NSW: Minimum of 3 Band 3's

- 1. Aged between 17-20 years
- 2. Completed secondary education (Year12) in the last two years
- 3. Be an Australian or New Zealand citizen or Australian Permanent Resident.
