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## About this course

This double degree course is designed for students who intend to follow career paths in either or both of Management and Psychology. Students are expected to find careers in either the private or public sectors. Students complete the Bachelor of Management and the Bachelor of Psychology concurrently. A single degree may be taken out when at least 72 credit points have been attained and the requirements of that degree met. The Bachelor of Management is designed for those who are making, or who plan to make, their careers in management in the business, public and non-governmental sectors. It is suitable both for those who have recently completed secondary studies and for those with some work experience. The course combines conceptual understanding and a practical orientation in Management, Government and Politics and Management, Governance and Policy.
