




Tried lots of different angles, because my original plan of having an overhead shot didn't look as good as I hoped.


Played with position of shadows and ended up choosing one where the pineapple takes up the most of the frame and everything else is slightly smaller.





Added in background flowers and fixed the colouring of that.




Evaluation

This food photography depicts pineapple in a unique and stylistic way. Taking inspiration from Wes Anderson, in the stylistic colouring and layout. This photograph was initially planned to be taken overhead and with use of different elements, but once setting everything up, it didn't look as good as I hoped, so i played around with the camera position and the objects layout. Once I got a wide variety of photos I played around with the layout. The background is extended behind the flowers, as to not make the photo appear too busy, although the table cloth has many elements, the repetition keeps the image balanced. Emphasis is placed on the pineapple as it is the largest element in the photograph and the coloring of the negative space (the table cloth) matches the pineapple which creates a sense of unity. The colour palette consists of yellow, greens and pinks which is common in Wes Anderson films, there is also similar use of tones. Having the pineapple presented like a cake is different to how fruits are usually photographed, attracting attention. The shadow of the hand reaching for the knife adds the human element to the photograph, as I enjoy the look of hands reaching towards objects in product photos, but having it as a shadow doesn't distract away from the pineapple. The leaves are placed in even spacing around the table so they look like the top of a pineapple and added that element of the product without having it in the actual photograph. Adding the grain and saturation to the photograph worked nicely with the colouring and objects in the photo, it created a unity between every object besides just the colouring, this also completed the Wes Anderson aesthetic. Natural lighting was used for this image, at a later time in the day to make sure shadows could be made without another lighting source. If I were to do this again, I would probably play around more with the flower shadows and the position of objects, but I really like how it turned out and captured the overall aesthetic I was aiming for.








Contact Sheet:


Evaluation

This product photo shows heart earrings in a saturated and 'feminine' environment inspired by Maisie Cousins. Coloured corn starch was used for the liquid, with various flowers and a skull that surrounds the earrings, red coloured lighting used in contrast with the blue. Yellow, blue and red are all primary colours and work really well together when saturated. The earrings are at the forefront of the image, as they are placed on a high point as well as centred. Levels of hierarchy keeps an emphasis on the earrings while still enabling other elements in the photograph to shine. As the flowers are similar, this creates repetition and unity surrounding the silver of the earrings, keeping an emphasis on the earrings. The liquid is used as negative space which takes up equal amount compared to the positive space. As the actual photo used coloured lighting and already looked exactly how I had wanted it to turn out, there wasn't much to do in post other then slight changes in saturation, contrast, etc. As setting up the position of everything wasn't planned, taking the photo was a 'natural' process, as I played with different angles and position until I found something i really liked, this worked really well as I think planning this photo to the dot wouldn't look as good as it does. This sickly use of liquid and flowers matches the earrings as they are of an actual heart, advertising it in both a unique and representative way. I am really happy with how the photo turned out as it captures the Maisie Cousins aesthetic perfectly and advertises the earrings in standout way.






Inspiration:




Contact Sheet:

Evaluation

For this photograph I wanted to advertise books in a way that I had never seen before and that also worked well with the author being advertised. Casey McQuiston's books both follow a similar colour scheme and match well with different gloves and hands. The use of repetition in both the product and hands gives an emphasis and pattern to the product, making it obvious that the books are the product. The green and pink contrast well, emphasizing the books. To take the photo, the camera was placed on a tripod and set with a timer, I then took photos of my hands holding the books. I used a combination of natural and artificial lighting, as I wanted to control the lighting as much as I could so it stayed consistent throughout each photograph. Then I stitched all the photos together in photoshop, then fixed the colouring and any glare. The positive and negative space is kept equal with the plain background and books, this keeps balance in the photo so it doesn't appear to busy. Doan Ly mostly loves flower photography, her compositional techniques and use of repetition inspired this photograph, especially one of her photograph she uses multiple hands to represent flowers, so I incorporated it with the books. In her photograph she uses multiple models, but I only had myself so I took a different approach to her which created a different, more surrealistic vibe.
